You're Not Alone

## What the Bible says to those from broken homes.

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You hoped things would change. You prayed for peace. You wished your family would be the way it ought to be.

But now you know. This won't happen. Dad and Mom aren't together any more.

> You should know this isn't what God intended. In fact, God's plan is for a husband and wife to remain together for life. Listen to what Jesus said,

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But in the beginning God made a man and a woman. That's why a man leaves his father and mother and gets married. He becomes like one person with his wife. Then they are no longer two people, but one. And no one should separate a couple that God has joined together." [Mark 10.6-9]

For whatever reason, one of your parents has left...and now **YOU** are left with a roller coaster of emotions: anger, embarrassment, bitterness, denial, even guilt. Perhaps you are thinking...

...no one understands me. ...it's my fault. ...I feel abandoned. ...what lies ahead?

You may not want to talk about these things. But you need to. Open up your heart to your pastor, priest or counselor. It may also help you to write down your feelings. This booklet can help you do that. In fact, you can make this your own private conversation with God. Let him speak to you through his words in the Bible. You respond to him through your recorded thoughts and whispered prayers.

## By your own hand

you satisfy the desires of all who live. Our LORD, everything you do is kind and thoughtful, and you are near to everyone whose prayers are sincere.

You satisfy the desires of all your worshipers, and you come to save them when they ask for help. [Psalm 145:16-19]

Is that how YOU feel? You may be surprised to know that the Bible describes many people who felt the same way. Jesus was one of them. He was often misunderstood. Once, while he told his disciples how he would suffer and die, they were busy arguing who would be the greatest in his kingdom.

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Jesus left with his disciples and started through Galilee. He did not want anyone to know about it, because he was teaching the disciples that the Son of Man would be handed over to people who would kill him. But three days later he would rise to life. The disciples did not understand what Jesus meant, and they were afraid to ask

Jesus and his disciples went to his home in Capernaum. After they were inside the house, Jesus asked them, "What were you arguing about along the way?" They had been arguing about which one of them was the greatest, and so they did not answer

After Jesus sat down and told the twelve disciples to gather around him, he said, "If you want the place of honor, you must become a slave and serve others!"

Then Jesus had a child stand near him. He put his arm around the child and said, "When you welcome even a child because of me, you welcome me. And when you welcome me, you welcome the one who sent me." [Mark 9.30-35]

Others don't see things the way you do. They don't understand the pain of rejection that you feel.

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But God does.

ASK YOURSELF:

FOLLOWERS ARGUED OVER WHO WAS THE GREATEST. HOW DO

YOU THINK HE FELT?

Only God can save me, and I calmly wait for him. God alone is the mighty rock that keeps me safe and the fortress where I am secure.

Ask Yourself:

What is God called

three times in these

verses? And what does

that mean to me?

I feel like a shaky fence or a sagging wall. How long will all of you attack and assault me? You want to bring me down from my place of honor. You love to tell lies, and when your words are kind, hatred hides in your heart.

Only God gives inward peace, and I depend on him. God alone is the mighty rock that keeps me safe, and he is the fortress where I feel secure. God saves me and honors me. He is that mighty rock where I find safety. [Psalm 62.1-7]

In the space on the next page, open up your heart in a letter to God. Tell him your feelings about what's happened in your family.

He knows what you're going through.



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Dear God,

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Don't be mistaken. Some guilt is real. It is the alarm clock of the soul. But not now. You are not the cause of the breakdown in your family. You are the victim.

Children suffer for the wrong choices of their parents. Consider what one biblical writer said about the ruin of his homeland...

Our LORD, don't forget how we have suffered and been disgraced. Foreigners and strangers have taken our land Ask Yourself.. Who suffers for the virong choices that you make? We are like children whose mothers are widows. YOUR FRIENds? OtheRS in YOUR The water we drink and the wood we burn cost far too much We are terribly mistreated; we are worn out and can find no rest. We had to surrender to Egypt and Assyria because we were hungry. Our ancestors sinned, but they are dead, and we are left to pay for their sins. [Lamentations 5.1-7]

That's why God's commandments carried consequences both for the parents and their children...

So remember that the LORD is the only true God, whether in the sky above or on the earth below.

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Today I am explaining his laws and teachings. And if you always obey them, you and your

descendants will live long and be successful in the land the LORD is giving vou. [Deuteronomy 4.39-40]

WHAT KIND OF SUCCESS ARE THESE VERSES REFERRING TO? HOES DOES You are suffering today THIS APPLY TO MY LIFE? because of choices one or both of your parents have made. It is not your fault and there is no reason to feel quilty. The hard part is not that you need their forgiveness, it is that YOU must forgive them, for it is in forgiving others that we show that we truly grasp God's mercy toward us.

ASK YOURSELF

Peter came up to the Lord and asked, "How many times should I forgive someone who does something wrong to me? Is seven times enough?"

Jesus answered

Not just seven times, but seventy-seven times! This story will show you what the kingdom of heaven is like:

One day a king decided to call in his officials and ask them to give an account of what they owed him. As he was doing this, one official was brought in who owed him fifty million silver coins. But he didn't have any money to pay what he owed. The king ordered him to be sold, along with his wife

and children and all he owned, in order to pay the debt. The official got down on his knees and began begging, "Have pity on me, and I will pay you every cent I owe!" The king felt sorry for him and let him go free.

He even told the official that he did not have to pay back the money.

As the official was leaving, he happened to meet another official, who owed him a hundred silver coins. So he grabbed the man by the throat. He started choking him and said, "Pay me what you owe!"

The man got down on his knees and began begging,


"Have pity on me, and I will pay you back." But the first official refused to have pity. Instead, he went and had the other official put in jail until he could pay what he owed. When some other officials found out what had happened, they felt sorry for the man who had been put in jail. Then they told the king what had happened. The king called the first official back

> in and said, "You're an evil man! When you begged for mercy, I said you did not have to pay back a cent. Don't you think you should show pity to someone else, as I did to you?" The king was so angry that he ordered the official to be tortured until he could pay back everything he owed. That is how my Father in heaven will treat you,

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if you don't forgive each of my followers with all your heart. [Matthew 18:21-35]

It's easy to feel abandoned. Perhaps you know what the writer of this Psalm was going through. Someone close to his heart had let him down.

I ask for your help, LORD God, and you will keep me safe.
Morning, noon, and night you hear my concerns and my complaints.
I am attacked from all sides, but you will rescue me unharmed by the battle.
You have always ruled, and you will hear me.
You will defeat my enemies because they won't turn and worship you.

My friend turned against me and broke his promise. His words were smoother than butter. and softer than olive oil But hatred filled his heart. and he was ready to attack with a sword Our LORD, we belong to you. We tell you what worries us, and you won't let us fall. [Psalm 55.16-22]

ASK YOURSELF ...

CONCERNING MY LIFE

If you ask for his help, God won't let you fall either. He will never abandon you. He knows all about you, including those dark corners no one else knows about. And yet he still OVES YOU!

You have looked deep into my heart, LORD, and you know all about me. You know when I am resting WHERE DOES GOD LOOK? or when I am working, WHAT DOES GOD KNOW? and from heaven you discover my thoughts. You notice everything I do and everywhere I go. Before I even speak a word,

you know what I will say, and with your powerful arm you protect me from every side. I can't understand all of this! Such wonderful knowledge is far above me Ask Younself... What does this writer say about God's thoughts toward me?

Nothing about me is hidden from you! I was secretly woven together deep in the earth below. but with your own eyes you saw my body being formed. Even before I was born, you had written in your book everything I would do. Your thoughts are far beyond my understanding, much more than I could ever imagine. I try to count your thoughts, but they outnumber the grains of sand on the beach. [Ps 139.1-6, 15-18a]

Walk out to the beach. Take a handful of sand and count the grains. If you finish (and you won't), figure out how many grains of sand are in the entire beach! That's how many thoughts God has of you! The prophet Isaiah wrote,

Tell the heavens and the earth to celebrate and sing; command every mountain to join in the song. The LORD's people have suffered, but he has shown mercy and given them comfort. The people of Zion said, "The LORD has turned away and forgotten us." The LORD answered, "Could a mother forget a child who nurses at her breast? Could she fail to love an infant who came from her own body? Even if a mother could forget, I will never forget you. [Isaich 49.13-15]



## Dear God,

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I heard a loud voice shout from the throne: God's home is now with his people. He will live with them, and they will be his own. Yes, God will make his home among his people. He will wipe all tears from their eyes, and there will be no more death, suffering, crying, or pain. These things of the past are gone for ever. <sup>[Revelation 21.3- 4]</sup>

In the meantime, let's be honest. Statistics are

not in your favor. Children from broken homes tend to leave school early. They tend to have broken homes themselves. They are more prone to illness and emotional struggles later in life. But amidst all this gloom there is hope. You don't have to be a statistic. You can rise above the rest by replacing your emotions, doubt, denial and false guilt with the **promises of God**.

I am at the point of death. Let your teachings breathe new life into me When I told you my troubles, you answered my prayers. Now teach me your laws. Help me to understand your teachings, and I will think about vour marvelous deeds. I am overcome with sorrow Encourage me, as you have promised to do. Keep me from being deceitful, and be kind enough to teach me your Law. I am determined to be faithful and to respect your laws. I follow your rules, LORD.

Don't let me be ashamed. I am eager to learn all that you want me to do; help me to understand more and more. <sup>[Psalm 119.25-32]</sup>

Let God speak to you through the Bible, and through others around you who can help. Be open to receive the good things God has for you.

I asked the LORD for help, and he saved me from all my fears. Keep your eyes on the LORD! You will shine like the sun and never blush with shame. I was a nobody, but I prayed, and the LORD saved me from all my troubles. If you honor the LORD, his angel will protect you. Discover for yourself that the LORD is kind. Come to him for protection, and you will be glad. <sup>[Psalm 34,4-8]</sup>

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
